From the Pastor's Desk.....

Friends,

We arrive in the month of April, just waiting to see what could be in store for us. In years past, it seemed almost a foregone conclusion that April means warmer weather and a settling of our schedules for at least a month or two. The big celebrations are over, and summer has not yet appeared on our horizons. This year we are having those assumptions challenged in a big way.

Easter is coming about as late as it possibly can, thanks of course to the timing of the full moon. (If you don't remember how Easter and the moon are related, check out last year's March newsletter.) With that change in date and schedule, we are seeing that many of the alignments in celebration that we take for granted are not materializing like we would want them to. The late date of Easter Sunday moves other dates, such as Pentecost, and we find that the Easter season is going to stretch into June this year, instead of ending in mid-May.

The more I have thought about the ways that this year looks so very different than the past few, the more I have realized that this is very much a God moment. We need to have our assumptions and regular schedules pushed, prodded, and tested occasionally. Routine is nice, and it is often said that we thrive in it. However, I am led to wonder just how much we actually thrive when routine becomes rote. If every day is the same in and same out, where is our space for the Spirit to do great things in our lives? If we never deviate from the schedule we have set, is there room for the creativity of God's call in our lives?

We may not always like it, but we need to be challenged in our routines. Jesus did that very thing time and again with the Pharisees and Scribes. He asked them difficult questions that were meant to break them out of the routines that kept them comfortable but separated from the people. Stories and Parables, healings and miracles taught them that sometimes we need to break the comfort of our daily cycle in order to see something wonderful that God has prepared for us.

I think that this year is a great opportunity to lean into the disruption. Our schedules are off, things aren't quite playing out in the expected ways. Rather than cling to the remnants of our plans like pieces of a foundered ship, let's be willing to let go a little bit and see where the tides of time take us this year. I encourage you to trust in God, and trust in one another as we find the new direction that this year will take.
